Date: Jan 13, 2025

CALL TO ORDER: President Kaleb Headings
OPENING DEVOTIONS: Pastor Steve Edmiston

AGENDA REVIEW: Kaleb moved to add to Old Business: Christmas clean up and to New Business 1. Thrivent Dollar acceptance and allocation and 2. Christmas collection allocation. Seconded by Pastor Steve. Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. Council officer selection Kaleb moved for Margy H.to remain as secretary. Myron K. was nominated as president and Wes vice president. Motion second by Kathy. Motion passed.
- 2. Bill McCroskey presented to council. He states that there are 23,000-25,000 downloads of the services and the audience is given no method of giving. It was suggested that St. John's uses the current service (Share Faith/Media Bands) for this service on a trial basis. This will cost \$49/ month plus 2.66% per transaction. Pastor Steve moved to add to current site and Ann seconded it. Motion passed.
- 3. Kaleb moved to accept the \$47 Thrivent Dollars and move to Joy Circle for use by the St. John's quilting group.
- 4. Dave B requested that finance committee meet to decide how to handle unbudgeted benevolence. He will follow up with Alpha Center for an uncashed check directed to them some time ago.
- 5. Council members to turn in their request for desired committees.
- 6. Thrift Shop has a new director. Melissa Barhorst. Mary has continued to help her during the transition.
- 7. Christmas benevolence was \$4820. Pastor Steve moved to give \$4000 to Lutheran Disaster Relief to assist victims of the wild fires in California. The rest of the funds to be used in Christmas decorations replacement (there is already \$114.29 set aside for that purpose). Kathy seconded the motion. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

Skinner painting had given a start date but then did not show. Kaleb will contact them again to pin down a date.

Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. Kaleb moved to approve as submitted. Pat seconded the motion. Motion passed.







- predicting or guessing future weather
