



### **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. \$26 Thrivent Choice Dollars given to St. John's is to be transferred to the Joy Circle account with "quilting" put in the memo line. Motion made by Margy, Kaleb seconded and motion passed.

Discussion regarding the annual report preparations and review. This is the report that goes out to the congregations regarding the activities of each committee.
