Date: Dec. 9, 2024

CALL TO ORDER: Vice President Myron Koester **OPENING DEVOTIONS:** Pastor Steve Edmiston

AGENDA REVIEW: The agenda was amended to add items to old and new business. Pastor Steve motion to approve as amended and Margy seconded the motion. Motion passed **NEW BUSINESS:**

1. Memorial Committee has recommended Tina Ike to fill a vacated position by Mike Rosengarten. This requires council approval. Pastor Steve moved that Tina fill this position. Ann seconded the motion. Motion passed.

Josh Ward has accepted the invitation to join council. Margy moved to nominated Josh for council. Ann seconded the motion. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Kaleb will be contacting Skinner on Jan. 6, 2025 to establish start date for completion of renovations. Predicted start date is the week of Jan 13, 2024.

Hoping to hire this week to fill the position of Director of the Lutheran Thrift Shop. Ann states that she was approached by a parishioner with the concern/ question of if there would be a crossover in time between Mary's departure and start of new director and would both be paid during this time. This was discussed and Ann moved that there be a crossover and both be paid for this time. Norb seconded the motion. Motion passed.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. Pastor Steve moved to approve as submitted and Norb seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURE'S REPORT: A copy of Treasurer's report was distributed with the agenda. Dave points out that the Capital Project Fund is getting close to needed funds (96%). He also notes that there is a change in variance due to slight reduction in insurance due to spread over 12 months. Ann moved to approve as submitted and Wes seconded the motion. Motion passed.

STAFF REPORT:

- Pastor Report-
- 1. Annual meeting and pancake breakfast went well.
- 2. The church was decorated for Christmas with 9 people helping. In addition, several people started some of the decorations beforehand.
- 3. Has officiated 2 funerals, 1 baptism and has baptism planned for next week. Will also officiate an adult baptism.
- 4. Welcome newborn Hudson Cavinder (attended meeting since both parents-Wes & Michelle are on council)
- 5. Will need communion assistance for Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services.
- 6. Pastor Steve will be traveling Dec 26-29. Has the services set up and has 3 volunteers but does need one more for 8:30 service. (2 per service).
- 7. Pastor Steve points out that Lent is coming and planning for this will soon be required.

- Ministry Education & Youth: Working on a Christmas gathering but still have to set the date for this.
- Ministry Music & Worship: Bell choir will perform Dec. 22 for both services. Also, plan to perform for the Saturday service next week. Deb reports having some difficulty getting the group together for practice due to health issues. Deb is trying to get the children's choir together as well. Deb will play the cello or violin and bell choir will perform for Easter. Ann mention that she would like to be singing Christmas songs during Advent and Pastor Steve pointed out that the church policy for this has changed to allow Christmas music during Advent and this has already been discussed with Holts (8:30) and Becky (10:30).
- Outreach Evangelism: Thanksgiving meals went well. Provided 54 meals. Also, about 4000 card for Cards for Christ from St. John's went out.
- Outreach Parish Life: Had lots of great help for pancake breakfast. Fed 47. Will try to have mid week Lenten meals. Council was asked to lead these. A sign up list was passed. The meals will be announced in the newsletter and bulletin. The menu will be announced in the bulletin. Time will be 5:30-6:30.
- Operations Finance: Nothing additions to Treasurer's report.
- Operations Property: Parts for the water fountain repairs have been ordered. Repairs will be done when parts arrive. Skinner date to be set Jan. 6, 2024 (to start the week of Jan. 13, 2024). Additional Notes:
