Lent arrives here in the month of March. It feels a little late in the year, but Ash Wednesday is March 5. We will have services at 1:00 in the Chapel and at 7:00 in the Church. I hope that you will join us as we begin the season of Lent.

The cross; the cross of Christ; the old rugged cross; come gather beneath the cross of Jesus. For this Lenten season, I want to encourage us all to ponder the cross of Christ our Lord. The cross stands on the front altar in our church. There is a cross behind the lectern. There are many crosses in our worship space and throughout the building and that is because, as Lutherans, we see God clearly on the cross. I'm not talking about the figure of Jesus on a crucifix but rather we see the character of God, the love and presence of God, the willing, sacrificial care of God very clearly on the cross.

In Roman times the cross was used as a brutal method of killing and controlling. Sometimes it took days to die, and the message was always, 'this could be you.' So no one wanted to die that way. In the love of God, Jesus was willing to die that way, for us, for you and for me. This is what I want us to ponder this year. What does the cross mean to us? What does the cross teach us? What can we do for others in light of the cross?

At our Ash Wednesday services there will be available for you, a pocket cross. It is something for us to hold onto, to bump into daily as a reminder of God's love for you and a reminder to contemplate Jesus' amazing gift at the cross. As we receive an ash cross on our foreheads, please take a cross for your pocket, and join me in pondering the gift the cross is for us all.

On the Wednesdays in Lent, beginning March 12, we will have Mid-week Lent services beginning at 7pm. Join us as we learn from the New Testament windows in our church. We will spend the weeks learning of Matthew and Mark, of Luke and John, and focusing finally on Jesus our Lord. You can also join us for a light meal before worship on those Wednesdays. Beginning at 5:30, we will gather together for food and fellowship. Come and be part of Lent at St. John's this year.





SECRETARY'S REPORT: A copy of the Secretary's report was distributed with the agenda. Typographical and spelling mistakes were pointed out. These corrections will be made by the secretary. Kathy moved to approve as amended and Ann seconded the motion. Motion passed.

TREASURE'S REPORT:

- 1. Christmas donations: \$4000 sent to Lutheran Disaster Relief for fire recovery in California and \$820 set aside for updates of Christmas decorations.
- 2. Requested a financial committee to decide on how to handle the unbudgeted benevolence. Volunteers were requested. Pastor Steve suggested that Dave, Lynn Pitchford, Lori Holt and he meet to discuss this. Melissa from the Thrift Shop suggested that Mary's pay for the transition period (as previously approved) come from the church accounts rather than the Thrift Shop. The amount needed would be approximately \$1100. It was clarified that the church pays the director's salary and then is reimbursed from sales. The rest of the funds from sales, if any remain, are used in outreach, helping those in need. Dave suggested that some of the funds from unbudgeted benevolence may be used for this. Pastor Steve moved that this be payed via line item 7018 titled Community Meals in Unbudgeted Benevolence. There is \$2311.65 in this account. Kathy seconded the motion and motion passed.

Applications are available in the church office or can be emailed to you. The deadline for turning in the application is May 30, 2025.




Laurence B. Anderson, Jr. Memorial
